Low Sunday

Low Sunday is the Sunday after Easter Day. Although it is often overlooked by churches now, its origins go back many years. There are various explanations for its name:



- It is in contrast to the 'High' festival of Easter. Lent had been a period of austerity and fasting which gave way to the rich feasts of Easter. At Low Sunday calm and normality were resumed.
- It is a corruption of the Latin word 'laudes' from which we derive the word 'Laud' (All glory laud and honour to thee Redeemer King).
- It is also called 'White Sunday'. Those who had been baptized at Easter wore their white robes until the following Sunday when these were replaced by ordinary clothes.

In the Methodist Church it was often celebrated as Local Preachers Sunday when there was an exchange of pulpits between nearby circuits. This gave an opportunity for a wider ministry and was often a welcome day off for Ministers after the hectic schedule of Lent and Easter.

But what has this to do with us in our modern world and thinking? Maybe we are like the disciples who began to hear that Jesus had risen but who were still questioning if it was true and who were trying to understand what it meant for

their future as his followers. Maybe like Thomas they were sceptical that anyone could rise from the dead. The doubts and fears were replaced with amazement and excitement when they actually met the risen Christ.

I trust that each of us have experienced the thrill of realising again what Easter really means – the forgiveness of our sins, the overcoming of death and the promise of eternal life. Is the joy of this realisation

going to have waned in the following days? Are we beginning to feel 'Low' by 'Low Sunday'?

Maybe the excitement has given way to the ordinary (like the white clothes being exchanged for the everyday ones and the feasts to mundane food.) Yet the One who rose again continues to live. He comes to us in the power of the Holy Spirit to enable us to be 'Easter People' all year long.

Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ' 1 Corinthians 15 57.

These will be taken to an orphanage and refugee centre in UKRAINE where they will be made into TRENCH CANDLES, which are used for light, heat and even cooking.




The soldiers also need (in good condition) socks, woolly hats and gloves. AND (NEW) toothbrushes, toothpaste and razors.
