Alpha Course


Alpha restarts **Thursday 8th January 7pm to 9pm** at Chris and June's house Tea Rose Cottage Edenhall.



# An extra reflection for you all, intended for the week of 30<sup>th</sup> November 2025:



We are about to celebrate the First Sunday of Advent and so we officially start the Christmas season. And as Lois pointed out last week the start of a new liturgical year.

It is not known, so says Wikipedia, when the period of preparation for Christmas that is now called Advent began, though it was certainly in existence from about 480. The word comes from the Latin *adventus* which means 'coming; arrival' so it's long

been Christian practice to observe the season by waiting and anticipating 'the coming of Christ', with Luke providing us two exemplars in Simeon and Anna (Luke 2:25-38).

Like many churches, it's been PMC's tradition to display and light the outer Christmas wreath candles according to the specific Advent Sunday and the central candle on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

This year we have available to us, courtesy of the North West England District, a candle-lighting liturgy for each of the Sundays – the themes being what the four candles represent, a Christian understanding of hope, peace, joy, and love – as well as a set of reflections for each day in Advent, which can be downloaded from <https://nwedmethodists.org.uk/advent/>. Do take a look if you don't already have something to help you focus as you 'wait and anticipate'.

As a help with the oncoming busyness, and for some an emotionally difficult time of the year, here's a lovely prayer written by Henri J.M. Nouwen specifically for the Advent season:

Lord Jesus, Master of both light and darkness, send your Holy Spirit upon our preparation for Christmas.

We who have so much to do seek quiet spaces to hear Your voice each day.

We who are anxious over many things look forward to your coming among us.

We who are blessed in so many ways long for the complete joy of Your Kingdom.

We whose hearts are heavy seek the joy of Your presence.

We are Your people, walking in darkness yet seeking the light. To You, we say, "Come, Lord Jesus!"
