# **Expect the Unexpected**

If you know me, you'll know that I like to plan and wish to know what's coming next. I often get caught thinking I've got everything under control and then God sends me a friendly reminder that I need to let go of that control and trust in them - something that is uncomfortable for me to say the least.

It reminds me of Zacchaeus. In Luke 19, Jesus is entering Jericho, so in order to get a better view Zacchaeus climbs a nearby tree. It may also have been to stay out of the way as he was the chief tax collector and probably disliked by a lot of the people. He couldn't have expected what happened next though. Jesus walks right under the tree, looks up and tells Zacchaeus that he's going to stay at his house that day.

To me, this bible verse acts as a reminder that even the most unexpected event can take place. If you told me three years ago that I'd be working for the church at the age of 24, I'd have told you to get out of my office. Yet, here I am.

We must leave ourselves open to God doing the unexpected in our lives. Something we never thought we'd achieve or somewhere we never thought we'd be.

We also have to remember that the unexpected isn't something to fear. If God has placed us in an unexpected situation, it's something to be excited about. It means that God has something wonderful in store and we are a part of that.



I think one of the ways in which we can best encounter God and grow in our faith is to be open to experiencing the unexpected. Thomas Merton, a catholic monk and social activist, said "the Christian life, and especially the contemplative life, is a continual discovery of Christ in new and unexpected places".

As we move into this new year, I wonder what new and unexpected ways you are going to experience the presence of God.

In whatever way that is, don't hold back. But get excited. God has something in store and wants you to be a part of that.



#### **Sad News**


