Light & Dark

David declares, at the opening to his 27th Psalm, "The Lord is my light and salvation." And in chapter 9, Isaiah prophesied – "Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles. The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; a light has dawned on those living in the land of darkness."



I wonder if you have ever taken time to think about what this 'light' and 'dark' are that the bible refers to in so many places? (You can probably quote a couple of different verses about light without looking them up.) Maybe it's obvious from the physical characteristics of light and dark and how they differ: illumination/concealment, warmth/coldness, colour/blackness; or the way they make you feel: safe/fearful, joyous/depressed, contented/agitated, etc.

Scanning down Psalm 27 and listing some of David's words under the headings of dark and light, we get the following: fear, dread, evil-doers, foes, enemies, war, adversity, anger, violence; and in contrast: salvation, protection, assurance, beauty, esteem, joy, music, grace, help, goodness, and life.

In Matthew 4 (verse 12 onwards) Jesus withdraws to Capernaum in Galilee and Isaiah's prophecy is quoted. The location is important: Zebulun and Naphtali were the very first tribes of the northern kingdom of Israel to be deported by the Assyrians 700 years before Matthew wrote. His point then? To the place where God's covenant judgment had fallen seven centuries before (Isaiah's 'gloom of a distressed land') Jesus brings his light of restoration, healing, and hope.

The exhortation Paul gave to the early church still holds true: "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light." Ephesians 5:8.



CHURCHES TOGETHER IN CUMBRIA - NEW VICE PRESIDENT REQUIRED from October 2023!



The present Vice President, Sheila Goodliffe, stands down at the end of September this year at the end of her 3 year period, and a new Vice President is required.

This is a voluntary post, but expenses incurred will be reimbursed and with the post holder also being a Trustee of CTIC.

The Vice President reports to the President, who is Rev Andrew Dodd at present until January 2024 when his period of office finishes.

As well as deputising for the President when required, duties include

- Ensuring the provision of admin. & secretarial services by an external secretarial agency which includes
 - Admin. & secretarial support for Trustees, Denominational Ecumenical Officers, the Chair of the Social Responsibility Forum and the Ecumenical Social Responsibility Officer (a part time appointment), the Chair of the Anna Chaplaincy Advisory Committee and the Anna Chaplaincy Lead person (a part time appointment)
 - Arranging and minuting relevant meetings in person or via Zoom
 - Keeping the CTIC website updated
- Editing the monthly Newsletter sent out widely
- Liaising with CT groups across Cumbria as required especially as the review and development of Mission Communities continues
- Co-ordinating the production of the Annual Report for the AGM and as required by the Charity Commission, ensuring appropriate reports are received, including the Annual Financial return, in conjunction with the Honorary Treasurer
- Being the designated Trustee to ensure the Charity Commission is kept up to date of any changes within CTIC

Those interested in applying for this post should have a demonstrable commitment to the aims of CTIC and be from any denomination. They should have experience of people and change management and charity governance.
