Hymns

Last Sunday at Skelton we had a 'Hymn Service'. Members of the congregation chose their favourite hymns with the opportunity to say why they had been chosen, we learned about the authors of the hymns and the background to their writing. We considered what message each one conveyed.

This set me thinking about the whole issue of hymns and songs used in our worship. For Methodists, singing is in our DNA – as much a part of worship as the spoken words. Whether we consider ourselves good at singing or not, joining together in music speaks to our very being.



Our hymns and songs cover a wide range of subjects. Mostly they speak to God, inviting our praise and worship, our asking for forgiveness and help, celebrating the events of the life of Jesus, pouring out our questions and needs about how to live the Christian life and our concerns for the needs of all. If the words are very familiar to us, it is easy to repeat them by

rote and not consider their meaning. Perhaps we just get lost in the tune! Do we recognise that those who provide our music are leading our worship as well as the preacher?

Although hymns are usually shared in Public Worship, they can be so much more valuable to us. How often do lines from hymns/songs come to us as we live life each day? As we do our daily work, or take a walk, or drive the car, we can find ourselves remembering words which can speak to us (and our needs) just at that time. So many hymns are based on Bible texts and God has used the hymn writers to convey his truths to us.

Have you ever just stopped to read the words and let them sink into your minds? We can find ones we do not know and discover that they give us new truths and insight. So, we thank God for the gift of song, enabling us to draw near to him.

As hymn 157 in Singing the Faith reminds us:

God has spoken – by his prophets. God has spoken – by Christ Jesus God has spoken – by the Spirit.




Penrith Mission Area Lent Groups

'Following the devastating news, All We Can will be responding to the earthquake and rescue efforts.




Our initial response is centred in Syria given access to existing networks for the most vulnerable, through our partners in the region.




