Holidays

When you read this, we should be on holiday in the Peak District in Derbyshire. I trust that we all enjoy holidays and even if these are no longer possible for us, that we have memories of holidays in the past.

The memories will vary – maybe they are remembered for their happy times or maybe their disasters!

We are more privileged than many in past years who were fortunate if they had one day a week break and who could only look forward to the occasional 'Holy Day' and time off. The word holyday is indeed derived from the name for such sacred days (probably Saints' Days). So, what do holidays teach us about our faith?



- An escape from the usual day to day life. We could also think that nobody knows us in a different location, so it doesn't matter what we do or say. We must remember that God is always there, the unseen witness to our actions. Psalm 139 and StF 835 asks the question "Where shall I go from Your presence". Is it not better to know God's ever present help rather than thinking we can hide from Him?
- The finding of rest and peace. We seek to leave troubles and problems behind, but they will still be there when we return home. Jesus said "Come to me, all you who are tired from carrying heavy loads and I will give you rest."
 Matthew 11:28-30. We can seek his help anywhere.
- Having new experiences. We like to see new places or try out new things. Rev 21:5 tells us 'Behold I make all things new.' This word is not just for holidays but for the whole of life. The verse continues by God saying 'I am the first and the last, the beginning and the end.' This means that His care and concern, His challenge and justice have always been and always will be.
- Turning our recreation into re-creation. Eph 4:17-18, 20-24 is entitled 'The New Life in Christ.' God who offers new things and His rest wants to recreate us turn us around. Then we can become more like Him.



No matter whom we are, God's re-creating power can be experienced and enjoyed. He wants every day to be a holiday – a Holy Day shared with him.


