The Birthplace of Peace

I wonder, when was the last time you allowed yourself to be vulnerable? Maybe you put yourself out there or tried something new, or maybe you opened up to someone about how you were truly feeling. To be vulnerable is to embrace discomfort and acknowledge risk.

This is the reason why most of us avoid being our true, authentic selves, around others. To risk being ourselves would be to risk humiliation or ostracism. However, to avoid that risk would be to avoid the opportunity to build real relationships and form authentic communities, which we as humans need to survive.

A friend recently reminded me of a quote from M. Scott Peck and Brené Brown which says, "there can be no vulnerability without risk; there can be no community without vulnerability; there can be no peace, and ultimately no life, without community. Vulnerability is the birthplace of connection and the path to the feeling of worthiness."



When putting together His 'rag-tag' group of disciples, Jesus is vulnerable. He puts Himself out there and calls out to Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John. He risks rejection with the desire to form a connection with these people. But we see in Matthew 4 that taking that risk pays off as they drop their nets and follow Jesus, embracing vulnerability themselves. Throughout the gospels, we see this pattern continue. In Luke 8 when the woman in the crowd is healed by reaching out and touching Jesus' cloak, or with the Canaanite woman in Matthew 15 who pleads for Jesus to heal her daughter.

These people allowed themselves to be vulnerable, but Jesus acknowledged the risk they'd taken and told them that they are loved. Jesus formed a movement of peace and justice through setting the example of being vulnerable and encouraging others to do the same. Through this, a community of people with a genuine connection came together and went on to change the world.

If we are to see change happen in this world, if we truly want to see peace and justice reign, then we need to ignore the societal norms that tell us to put on a façade, and allow ourselves to be vulnerable.

Today I encourage you to pray "Loving God, be with me in my vulnerability and bless me with the fruits that it brings. Help me to strive for peace through the example that Jesus set. Amen."

I want to introduce you to a series we will be running over the 4 weeks of June, here at PMC on Sunday mornings, in response to requests we've had. It's called *Unpacking the Bible*, and we are really excited about it!

You know, in my last eight years as a minister, I've had many people asking me the same thing – *'I have this problem with the Bible....'*

Sometimes it's the brutality and bloodshed, or the difference between the God of the Old Testament, and the God seen in Jesus in the New. Sometimes it's a really obscure passage that they can't understand, or a law or command, which seems unfair, discriminatory, misogynistic, or otherwise at odds with ordinary decent behaviour.

Sometimes it's that they simply can't believe what they're reading – that a fish could swallow a man, or an ark could contain all known species of animals, or that God placed the entire fate of humanity on two people called Adam and Eve and what they did with a snake and a piece of fruit.

We are told that the Bible is the word of God, and yet some bits are violent, disgusting or just baffling! We are told that the Bible is inerrant, infallible and without contradiction - but then we discover there are lots of contradictions, and things written that we now know are just not true. We are told that the Bible is about a loving God, but sometimes what we read seems at odds with that. Let's be fair. The Bible is difficult. It is confusing. But maybe that's because we sometimes try to control it, or tame it, or make it support what we want it to say. To open the Bible means risking our theology, our presuppositions, our deepest held beliefs.

My hope is that this series will be an act of rediscovery. We want to explore how we read and interpret the Bible, look at some of the myths we have about the Bible, work out how to make sense of the Bible, and fall in love with the Bible all over again – for it to be a text that helps us to encounter more of God, liberate us, and empower us, and thrill us!

So, please join us either physically at 10:30am each week of June, or catch us on YouTube, as together, we start 'Unpacking the Bible'.
