Mind-blowing

It seems a strange thing to want to expose our minds to being 'bent' or 'blown', but who doesn't like a film or novel that leaves you in a state of disorientation, or your imagination fired as you try to make sense of what just happened? The mind-blown emoji is a head with a mushroom cloud above indicating the severity of the brain meltdown within.

But isn't this such a necessary part of coming to faith and our ongoing discipleship experience?

The apostle Paul had his mind-blown from his blinding Damascene conversion. So much so, that he spent three years in Arabia and another (circa) eleven years in Tarsus before beginning his mission in earnest. (I'm no expert but it is suggested that there's a 14-year gap between Acts 9: 25 and Acts 9: 26 on the basis of Gal 2: 1.)

It's speculative, but makes sense to me, that Paul needed this time to completely rebuild, refocus, reimagine ... everything he thought he knew about God, Israel, the Torah, Hebrew history, writings and oral traditions, the Gentiles (and their philosophies), and God's plan for humankind ... all of which needed to be re-centred on the revelation of Jesus as Lord, which clearly continued during

this period (2 Cor 12: 2-4).

No wonder then that Paul can say in his epistle to the Romans (12: 2): "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." He had thought deep and hard about it all – even Peter acknowledges the intellectual depth of his writings (2 Peter 3:16).



So, what was Paul's mission then? Not simply 'to the Gentiles', but Christ's objective of making a new humanity (Eph 2: 15-16) where the established structures and divisions (the 'pattern of this world') no longer applied, where "there is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal 3: 28)

We'd do well to allow ourselves to be challenged about the things we think we know and be bent to the same mind-blowing end.


