Be Boulder?

It's worth a reminder of the theme of PMC's Church Weekend, especially as we've kept the title from last year.



It's a play on words, not a spelling mistake, calling us as a Church to be both 'bolder' in our mission, and 'boulder', in our understanding of what it means to be a church of 'living stones':

As you come to Him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to Him— you also, **like living stones**, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

1 Peter 2: 4,5.

In our exploration session last year, I shared that the leaders had been looking at various Old Testament passages to see what might have influenced Peter to coin such a phrase. The setting up of stones in Israel's past were markers of historic significance, reminders of God's interventions such as the crossing of the Jordan in Joshua 3 & 4 with miraculous receding waters on route to the Promised Land, or the very personal encounter of blessing which Jacob had at Bethel in Genesis 28. But the stones in these and other narratives were called to be more than reminders, they were appointed to be witnesses of these great events.

That's why, I think, there's much more depth to Peter's words than us simply coming together somehow to make a community. Of course, we want to celebrate PMC's 150-year anniversary and give thanks for the many memories and those who have served before us, but we are called to do more than remember. In our generation we too must be living witnesses to the ongoing work of Jesus for us, in us, and through us.

And that's why there was no rush to find a new theme for the weekend – the 'living stones' message is one we probably need an annual reminder of! So come as you are, ready to share, with the expectation that God has plans for the next 150 years, starting with us.

Be Boulder Anniversary Walk

This year's anniversary walk is one that was enjoyed on several occasions as part of the church's Summer Evening programmes.

On leaving the church we will firstly make our way to the Thacka Beck Nature Reserve. Our route then follows the Penrith-Catterlen bridleway, eventually dropping down to cross a couple of footbridges over the River Petteril. After passing beneath the M6 we then reach the weir from where water is drawn off to feed the historic Thacka Beck that flows through the centre of town. We return along the footpath beside the West Coast main line to reach the Nature Reserve again, then PMC.

The walk

5 miles in length - about 2½ hours group walk
Generally flat but a little boggy in places
Some sections of long grass that may be wet
Would prefer not to have dogs, but any coming
would need to be able to clamber over stiles
Three or four stiles
Sheep and cattle in some of the fields
Bring a snack for the half-way point




Alpha Course

Do come if you are intrigued or, if you are convinced already, bring a friend!



We are a Fair Trade Church, and here is an extract from a letter received from 'Transform Trade' who used to be known as Traidcraft Exchange:

As well as working for transformation in local communities, we campaign for systematic changes to laws and policies – because without radical changes to the systems which exploit the most vulnerable, ending justice in trad it impossible.

Over the next year, there are three big changes that we are close to realising:

- 1. A fashion watchdog to regulate and improve the behaviour of UK fashion brands towards their suppliers.
- 2. A new law to hold businesses to account for human rights violations in their supply chains.
- 3. Up to eight new homeworker policies created by major UK fashion brands to support thousands of the world's most disadvantaged workers.
