## **Living Stones**

As you come to Him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to Him— you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house. 1 Peter 2:4-5

At PMC last weekend, we had our 'Be Boulder' weekend, where we celebrated our Church's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary and considered where God is calling us now.



On the Friday night, we had a quiz. As part of the quiz, each team had to build an innovative design using Lego. One group presented just one Lego brick as their entry. Understandably, they didn't get any points, as Lego only works when it's put together with other Lego bricks!

One of the Bible passages we considered during the weekend

was 1 Peter 2, where we get the strange verses above. What on earth does it mean to be 'living stones', because stones are not 'living', are they? They are inanimate objects – rocks that just stay put where they are. So how are we 'living stones'?

The answer is found in the Lego example we had from Friday night! As a church, on our own, we are pretty pointless. But when we come together, as a community of God's people, that's when God can work among us!

You can't make a building with just one stone – they have to be put together as a collection of stone to make something useful. Working together, stones have value.

We are the church, you see, not the buildings. Just as God became incarnate in Jesus to lead us to God, so the church has been formed by Christ to be His continued incarnation in the world – His way of leading others to God.


That's what makes us 'living' stones – being a community that works and serves together to reflect God's love, and to be the vehicle for others to experience it for themselves.

There is a famous story from Sparta. A spartan king had boasted to a visiting Monarch about the great walls of Sparta. The visiting Monarch looked around and could see no walls. He said to the Spartan king, 'where are these walls about which you boast?' The king pointed to the people of Sparta who had gathered to meet the monarch. 'These', he said, 'are the walls of Sparta. Every person is a brick'.

That's what church is – living stones – and you are a part of it! So, may we, together as a family of God's people, be the living stones that bring Christ to the communities in which we live.



### **Match Funding Opportunity for PMC**

As we have highlighted on several occasions, PMC has been using dwindling reserves to cover shortfalls over the last several years which is no longer sustainable and puts in jeopardy our ability to continue our existing ministries.

However, it has been brought to the attention of the Treasurer Team and shared with Church Council that a group of church members, who wish to remain anonymous, have generously committed to help with the current financial situation.

They have proposed that they will 'match fund' up to a value of £25,000 any increases to regular giving this year (starting from May when we were encouraged to review our giving).

If church can respond to this offer, we have the possibility of increasing our overall giving by £50,000 this financial year which would go a long way to address the anticipated shortfall!

We know it's a big ask, but for many of our regular givers, any increased giving you can commit to has the potential of making an even bigger difference. If you don't like arithmetic, here are a couple of examples:

Someone currently gives £50 per month. They decide to up that to £75 per month. With the match funding, this becomes £100 per month, doubling the original amount.

Another person gives £5 per week and decides they can double this to £10. With the match funding applied, this effectively triples the original amount to £15 per week!

Please do not go beyond your means – this is an appeal to those of us with resources to prayerfully consider our response to the ongoing costs of the outreach we do as a church in our community.

# We are a Fair Trade Church, and here is an extract from a letter received from 'Transform Trade' who used to be known as Traidcraft Exchange:



As well as working for transformation in local communities, we campaign for systematic changes to laws and policies – because without radical changes to the systems which exploit the most vulnerable, ending justice in trad it impossible.

Over the next year, there are three big changes that we are close to realising:

- 1. A fashion watchdog to regulate and improve the behaviour of UK fashion brands towards their suppliers.
- 2. A new law to hold businesses to account for human rights violations in their supply chains.
- 3. Up to eight new homeworker policies created by major UK fashion brands to support thousands of the world's most disadvantaged workers.
