# **Hospitality**

Recently we had a guest staying with us for a weekend break. In another two weeks we expect guests again, this time two adults and a dog. Over the years we have had many visitors either to stay or to share meals with us. I am sure

many of you have had similar experiences.

When guests are expected there has to be preparation. Are the bedrooms ready? Is the house clean? What will we eat and have we the provisions to fulfil the menus? This is always assuming that the visit is planned but what happens when we have unexpected guests? We would still try our best to provide hospitality even if it was 'makeshift' and 'rough and ready'.

Hebrews 13: 2-3 says 'Remember to welcome strangers in your homes. There were some who did that and welcomed angels without knowing it'. This refers back to a story told in Genesis 18. Abraham was sitting at the entrance to his tent when three



strangers came near. Abraham greeted them with the invitation to refresh themselves at his home where they were given water to wash and food to eat to give strength for their journey. Abraham said he was honoured that they were there and he was pleased to serve them. They then gave a message to Abraham and his wife Sarah to say they would have a son. This seemed most unlikely because the couple were well past child-bearing age. However, the promise was given and in due time fulfilled and they had a child. They realised that the strangers they had welcomed were indeed angels from God.

Is this a reminder to us, perhaps in two ways? Are we able to share hospitality when this is possible and thus to bless others? Also, do we look to find 'Angels' in unexpected places? They probably won't have halos and wings but will look very ordinary, yet they demonstrate the love and care of God to us and to others by their compassion in word and deed.

#### **Renwick Methodist Church Final Service**

There has been a Methodist presence in the village of Renwick on the east fellside of the Eden valley since probably the mid-18<sup>th</sup> century.

Starting out with meetings in people's homes, a first chapel was built in 1818/19 with the current chapel largely rebuilt by 1905. The final service of worship was held there on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2023 led by the Revd Dave Milner and was an opportunity for people from the East of Eden Mission Community to gather along with others



with connections to the chapel to give thanks to God for His faithfulness.

The chapel was full, with many others seated in the adjoining Sunday School room and the theme running through the service was 'Past, Present, Future'. Greetings had been received from former ministers, the Revds. Les Wallace, Barrie Lees and Alan Gawthrop and memories were shared by 4 representatives from some of the local families: Ian Little, Thelma nee Jackson, Mary nee Dickinson and Moyna nee Dickinson. Looking at Hebrews 13:1-8 Revd Dave spoke about change and how there is always change taking place and though it can be good we are often unsettled by it. However, we need to think about what is dependable and where we can take our bearings from: 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever.'

Everyone was invited to share in bread and wine and Revd Dave was assisted in this by other clergy from the Mission Community. Relevant hymns were played on the organ by Helen Armstrong with Keith Speck leading some songs on guitar. The final hymn, with words by Joseph Hart, was a fitting end:

This, this is the God we adore, our faithful, unchangeable friend, whose love is as great as his power, and neither knows measure nor end;

'Tis Jesus, the first and the last, Whose Spirit shall guide us safe home; We'll praise him for all that is past, And trust him for all that's to come.

Before fellowship continued over hot drinks and tray bakes everyone joined to sing the grace, 'Be present at our table, Lord', with encouragement to sing in parts as would have happened in days gone by.

Looking to the future the hope is that, allowing for all due process, the proceeds from the sale of the chapel will be used towards redevelopment in All Saints Church, Renwick, where the remaining Methodist members now join for worship.

Oh, Spirit, let me be a candle of comfort in this world let me burn with peace


#### **Carols by Candlelight**
