

# Weekly Bulletin Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November 2023

### From the East

I know it's not yet Advent and I'm aware that closer to 6<sup>th</sup> January (Epiphany) might be a better time to share these thoughts. But at around this time each year I tend to think about the story of Matthew's account of the 'wise men' simply because they, along with Simeon and Anna in Luke, are clearly active in anticipating the birth of someone special, probably for a long time before the narratives we collectively consider to be 'the Nativity'.

If you read the first 12 verses of Matthew 2 with an inquisitive mind, one can't help but come away with a few questions.

Who were these 'wise men'? Where from the east did they come? Why were they looking for a significant event in a distant land in the first place? How could they conclude just by looking at the night sky that a significant Jewish king would be born? What compelled them to find and worship him? How did they know to follow 'his star' and astronomically, how does that work?

Interesting questions, but the reality is we can never be absolutely certain and an internet search session will send you in many different directions. Our caricature Christmas card image of three camel-riding kings is pure speculation. (There were three gifts not necessarily three men and no mention of camels.) Many embellished stories, songs and artwork over the centuries have created for us a colourful mythology to enjoy.



I find a possible connection to the story of Daniel compelling: "King Nebuchadnezzar appointed him chief of the magicians, enchanters, astrologers and diviners" (Dan 5:11). Historically, Magi were associated with both Babylonian astrologers and Persian priests and their wisdom contained a mix of astrology, astronomy, interpreting dreams, and practicing magic.

Matthew shows they knew scripture too - they quoted Micah 5:2 to Herod and his entourage. This makes me think they were familiar with Daniel's story too, perhaps even tracing their lineage back to that period – which would help

answer a couple of the questions above. No doubt they were impressed with his ability to interpret visions/dreams as well as his and other prophets' statements about the future.

Whoever they were, their presence and message were taken with utmost seriousness and Herod was deeply disturbed. I wonder if Matthew is emphasising that the birth of Jesus is so much bigger than the prevailing Jewish worldview – it's truly global news. Are we willing to discern, follow and share this news with the same commitment that they did?

If you have school-age young people in your life, you may have heard of NISCU – Northern Inter-Schools Christian Union.

NISCU is a charity covering most of Cumbria, North Lancashire and the Craven area. NISCU workers help schools with their R.E. provision from a Christian perspective. This might take the form of supporting the RE teaching with lessons or workshops, helping to provide Collective Worships, leading clubs, encouraging and training volunteers, providing a listening service or any other way NISCU can support if asked.

Here in the Eden Valley there are currently two part-time staff; Andi Taylor, who mostly works with schools in Upper Eden, and Ruth Evans, who works with schools in the Penrith area – including the many rural primary schools. Andi is particularly skilled in encouraging children to create artworks (you may see them on display in schools) or you may have heard of Fajita the chicken – a puppet who often accompanies Ruth!

During the festive season you will often find Andi & Ruth involved with 'Christmas walkthrough' events. These are opportunities to invite children of different ages to come and 'meet' some of the key characters involved in the Biblical nativity, and find out the reason for the season – that Jesus came to earth as a baby, as a part of God's big story of bringing love and salvation to a world in need. They love to tell children of the hope that Jesus brings. This year, in our smaller schools, this will also involve children making their own 'Christmas story cards' with fingerprint pictures for each aspect of the story.


