Happy Christmas!

Many Christmas cards will feature snowy scenes with a festive, redbreasted robin. I wonder if you have either sent or received one. But perhaps the true Christmas bird is not the robin (or even a turkey!) but the goldfinch.

Yes, here is the goldfinch perched on Mother Mary's finger. The story goes that as Jesus carried his cross on the Via Dolorosa, a little goldfinch was so distressed to see the agony of Jesus that it flew down to try to help. It couldn't lift the cross itself, but the goldfinch instead tried to peck away at the thorns in the crown of thorns on lesus' head. As it did so, some of lesus' blood dropped onto the little goldfinch's head. So now, today, the goldfinch has a red spot on its head. By including the bird in their nativity scenes, painters like Bernardo Daddi, point the way forwards to the story of Christ's passion and the cross.

When I first saw this painting, upstairs in the Manchester Art Gallery, I did

wonder what the bird was doing there on Mary's finger, but I was much more struck by the compassionate way in which the Christ Child reaches his hand up towards his mother's cheek. Her look is one of tenderness, and perhaps even sadness. Maybe, the warnings she has been given by the Wise Men (albeit cryptically in their choice of gifts like the myrrh), more strongly by Simeon and Anna in the Temple, and indeed by Gabriel at the annunciation, all have led her to realise that her son will not have an easy life. And, neither will she! "Sorrow, like a sharp sword, will break your heart..." In this painting, then, Jesus reaches up as if to say, "Don't cry, Mum."

Actually... a very similar story about how the Goldfinch got the red patch on its head is told about how the Robin got its red breast. Even in its entry about the European Robin, Wikipedia says (so it must be true!): "Legend has it that when Jesus was dying on the cross, the robin, then simply brown in colour, flew to his side and sang into his ear in order to comfort him in his pain. The blood from his wounds stained the robin's breast, and thereafter all robins carry the mark of

Christ's blood upon them." So, you don't need to be moan the secular-ness of all those Christmas cards with the jolly, plump red robin on them, because they are really pointing us towards the man that the Christ Child grows up to be – his cross and his resurrection.



Everyone's welcome. You're invited, no matter your background or beliefs. It's free and there's no pressure to come back.



A New Year Resolution - try a Daily Reflection App!

While you are all digesting the last of the turkey and your thoughts turn to new year resolutions, perhaps you might consider using one of the daily Bible devotional apps that you can download to your phone or tablet.

But which one? Here are my top tips for three apps I think are well worth considering. You can find them on google play, or App store.

1. Lectio 365 - FREE!



This is an app developed by the 24/7 Prayer team. It includes a morning devotion that begins with reading a Psalm, some prayers, the reading of another Bible text, and some commentary / reflection. You can listen to the audio, or just read it. Takes about 10 minutes. Quite evangelical in theology. There is also an evening, Compline type reflection (which I really like) which is more contemplative – also about 10 minutes.

2. Reflections - £2.99 a quarter



This app, from the Church of England, is one Trace and I do together each day. It's good in that it includes each of the three lectionary texts for the day – so in 3 years, you'd more or less read the whole Bible! There is a link to each of the Bible passages, and then a written commentary by a different contributor who changes roughly every couple of weeks. Some you will prefer more than others!

3. Pray as you go - Free



This is my favourite app at the moment! In the style of Ignatian spirituality, the daily prayer can be read or listened to. Takes about 10 minutes and begins with some gentle, contemplative music, then a Bible text is read, followed by some reflection and meditation, before the text is read for a second time. There are also a number of other different spiritual devotions you can listen to depending on your mood! Trace and I listen in the evenings – but can be done any time. I love it!

Whichever you choose to do – spending intentional time with God each day is a great habit, so enjoy!

EAST CUMBRIA METHODIST CIRCUIT - REVIEW OF PROPERTY ASSETS



This new Circuit came into being on 1st September 2023 as the Penrith and Kirkoswald and Alston Moor Circuits merged. In developing a vision and strategy for the new Circuit the need to review our property assets has become apparent. We have recently sold Ainstable, Renwick and Sleagill chapels - with Salkeld Dykes chapel also now no longer needed.

As we develop Ecumenical Mission Communities, we are now looking for a volunteer to ideally manage these assets, and in particular, to lead a review of the remaining 6 chapels and 6 Manses. You will also help the Circuit to evaluate our future building needs, taking into account the current conditions which are outlined in recent Quinquennial inspections, and the Circuit's overall Vision and Mission Statement.

This will be time limited project to be completed during 2024 ensuring compliance with well documented Methodist procedures. Reviewing our manses will include liaison with the managing agents for the two that are currently let out.

An honorarium payment will be available for delivery of the required recommendations.
