# Giving

One hallmark of a healthy Christian community will be its generosity in all areas of its life. Jesus calls us to be a community of those who love one another and who seek to share our lives and the transformational news of his love with our neighbours.

As a Circuit we encourage generosity and recognise that it is an attitude which has many expressions, e.g. you are being generous when you give someone a listening ear, or when you refrain from being unnecessarily critical. You are generous when you join a rota to do something mundane or unseen and when you offer a prayer for someone. It's a long list: anything that we allow ourselves to be interrupted by which costs us our focus, our time, or our resources for the benefit of something other than ourselves.

It's also in this context which giving financially to our local church sits. At services the baskets go around, not to 'collect money' but to receive our offerings of

gratitude for God's overflowing generosity towards us.

Jesus spoke a lot about money and our attitude towards it <sup>[1]</sup> (surprisingly more than some other subjects we might think of as more important), summed up perfectly with 'For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.' <sup>[2]</sup>

But how should we give and how much should we give?



Giving ought to be planned – thought about, prayed about, and budgeted according to our own financial situation<sup>[3]</sup>. Planned giving is usually done through standing order or an envelope scheme. On occasions we might also be challenged to go beyond this, perhaps a special appeal for a specific need. Church treasurers may remind people to review what they already have in place – not to get people to go over their means, but to adjust as appropriate to changing circumstances.

What are we giving to/how is the money used? At PMC, as an example, the primary running costs are staff and buildings, both essential to the mission we

are called to. We forward money to Circuit for our ordained minsters and administrator and we employ our lay minister direct. Our normal building costs are largely met by the moneys received through the letting of our rooms to third-parties when they are not in use by church.

We mustn't forget though that most of what we do as a Circuit is done through volunteering. It's like our financial gifts are multiplied several times over by those who give their time.

The love of Jesus compels us to be cheerfully generous.





# Try a Daily Reflection App!

Perhaps you have considered using one of the daily Bible devotional apps that you can download to your phone or tablet. But which one?

Here are my top tips for three apps I think are well worth considering. You can find them on Google Play, or Apple App store.

#### 1. Lectio 365 – FREE!



This is an app developed by the 24/7 Prayer team. It includes a morning devotion that begins with reading a Psalm, some prayers, the reading of another Bible text, and some commentary / reflection. You can listen to the audio, or just read it. Takes about 10 minutes. Quite evangelical in theology. There is also an evening, Compline type reflection (which I really like) which is more contemplative – also about 10 minutes.

### 2. Reflections - £2.99 a quarter



This app, from the Church of England, is one Trace and I do together each day. It's good in that it includes each of the three lectionary texts for the day – so in 3 years, you'd more or less read the whole Bible! There is a link to each of the Bible passages, and then a written commentary by a different contributor who changes roughly every couple of weeks. Some you will prefer more than others!

#### 3. Pray as you go - Free



This is my favourite app at the moment! In the style of Ignatian spirituality, the daily prayer can be read or listened to. Takes about 10 minutes and begins with some gentle, contemplative music, then a Bible text is read, followed by some reflection and meditation, before the text is read for a second time. There are also a number of other different spiritual devotions you can listen to depending on your mood! Trace and I listen in the evenings – but can be done any time. I love it!

Whichever you choose to do – spending intentional time with God each day is a great habit, so enjoy!

# EAST CUMBRIA METHODIST CIRCUIT REVIEW OF PROPERTY ASSETS

This new Circuit came into being on 1st September 2023 as the Penrith and Kirkoswald



and Alston Moor Circuits merged. In developing a vision and strategy for the new Circuit the need to review our property assets has become apparent. We have recently sold Ainstable, Renwick and Sleagill chapels - with Salkeld Dykes chapel also now no longer needed.

As we develop Ecumenical Mission Communities, we are now looking for a volunteer to ideally manage these assets, and in particular, to lead a review of the remaining 6 chapels and 6 Manses.

You will also help the Circuit to evaluate our future building needs, taking into account the current conditions which are outlined in recent Quinquennial inspections, and the Circuit's overall Vision and Mission Statement.

This will be time limited project to be completed during 2024 ensuring compliance with well documented Methodist procedures. Reviewing our manses will include liaison with the managing agents for the two that are currently let out.

An honorarium payment will be available for delivery of the required recommendations.
