# Deliveries

When you think of 'shopping' do you picture a busy supermarket or a crowded high street? These used to be everyday common experiences

as we returned home fully laden with bags and parcels. But now such things have changed for many people. We receive our shopping by means of 'deliveries'. We order our grocery supplies on-line and turn to catalogues or web sites for a wide variety of other purchases.

This has of course a knock-on effect with less people in town centres and some shops having to close, but it is a positive experience if you do not have transport or have mobility issues which made shopping a chore rather than a good visit.

Why do I talk about shopping in this season of Lent? I believe there are similarities from which we can learn:

 We need to know what goods we require and the best place to obtain these.
 What do we expect Lent to teach us and is it important anyway? For Christians it can be a time of reflection when we seek to experience again

what the Passion of Jesus means and what its impact can have on our faith pilgrimage. To help us we have the accounts in the Bible, we might be part of a Lent Group, our churches might have the symbols of this season displayed on a cross and we might meet with others in the special services in Holy Week.

• When we place an order on-line we usually receive an acknowledgment and a date when the goods should be delivered. Do we think that the events we remember in Lent 'just happened' or can we realise that they were in God's plan for the rescue and renewing of his wayward creation? The Old



Testament may not give a 'date' for this to happen but it definitely foretells the coming of Jesus and explains he will be the 'Suffering Servant' – See Isaiah 52v13 to end of chapter 53.  Just before our goods are delivered to our door's we often receive a message confirming the delivery time and details of any changes to the order. This reminds us of John the Baptist whose preaching told of the imminent arrival of the One much greater than him, the One long promised.

As we journey from now to Good Friday may we realise again God's great love for us. Unlike the shopping which will either be eaten or the goods which will wear out, our God is an enduring God and his call to us is for life.

The CAP money course is a money management course that teaches budgeting skills that can help you to make the most of your money, and to worry less about money. The course has a proven track record; it has been running for over 25 years though the material has recently been updated.

The content is relevant to most people who want to be more in control of their finances. The material is very accessible and easy to follow. The course can either be run over 4 sessions of about 2 hours or a shortened course can be run in a day.


