Excuses



How good are you at making excuses?

You would rather not attend an event to which you have been invited; you do not (or cannot) do the task you have been asked to do; an outfit is not to your liking. To soften the blow you offer an excuse as to why such situations are not possible. Hopefully these reasons will be accepted by the other party.

Excuses are nothing new, particularly if God is calling someone to work for him.

- "I'm too young" was the excuse of Jeremiah when God called him to be a Prophet. (Jeremiah Ch 1). God told him not to make that excuse and not to be afraid. He had been chosen before he was born and would be given the words he must speak.
- "I'm too old" could have been the excuse of Abraham as he was 75 years old when called to go to an unknown land which God would show him. (Genesis Ch 12). Later he was promised a son to carry on the family line and again he said "I'm too old", (Genesis Ch 18) but God assured him that the impossible would happen so that the divine purpose would be carried out.
- "I can't speak" was the excuse of Moses when he was called to lead his people out of slavery in Egypt. (Genesis Ch 4). Moses asked God to send someone else but he was promised the help of Aaron who was more eloquent and together they approached Pharaoh who eventually let the people leave.
- "I'm too bad" could have been the response of Saul when God called to him
 as he travelled to Damascus to persecute the early Christians. (Acts Ch 9).
 With all that he had done to harm the followers of Jesus how could he
 respond to God's voice calling him to change? Yet we know that change took
 place as he became the Missionary to many places and wrote letters of
 encouragement and challenge.

In all these situations God knew best and whatever human frailties existed he could enable the excuses to be overcome. To what does God call us, both as

individuals and churches? We may have heard his call long ago or in more recent times and yet we waver with our own form of excuse. God will not stop calling people of all ages and abilities so that his work can continue and grow. How do we respond?

'Have you heard God's voice; has your heart been stirred? Are you still prepared to follow? Have you made a choice to remain and serve, though the way be rough and narrow?

Will you walk the path that will cost you much and embrace the pain and sorrow? Will you trust in God who entrusts to us the disciples of tomorrow? (StF 662)

Earth Hour is a worldwide annual event ran by the World Wildlife Fund (WWF). The event is designed to encourage individuals, communities, and businesses to give an hour for Earth, landmarks and businesses also switching off non-essential electric lights for one hour between 8:30pm and 9:30pm (usually on the last Saturday of March). Originating from a lights-off event in Sydney, Australia, in 2007, the event has been run every year since 2008, with more and more countries joining the tradition every year.

Below are some of the ways you can participate:

- **Switch off** take an hour away from your screens, put your phone on do not disturb and spend some time with loved ones or by yourself
- Spend some time outside if you have access to a safe outdoor space, spend some time reconnecting with the world around you (warmly wrapped up of course!)
