Here Comes the Son



This weekend is the start of March and the meteorological start of Spring. It's great that Spring is coming! The daffodils and crocuses are poking up; the birds are singing again; and the mornings and evenings are lighter for longer;

Don't you just love the light and the sun shining more? It makes us feel good, doesn't it!

I remember once walking through a dark forest on a sunny day with my young daughter. We saw a small clearing in the trees where the sun was able to penetrate and shine down like a big spotlight – and so we crawled through the trees and just sat absorbed in the wonder of the light!

It's great when, in our often dark worlds, something of light shines through. Light revives us - gives us energy. Light seems to give us life itself!

God, and Jesus in particular, is often described as being our light. John 8:12 says: *"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."*

God is light - our energy, our hope, our life – the very thing that invigorates us and revives us. And don't you agree we need more of that light in our lives?

So, how can we encounter more of God's light?

Simply by spending time, like me and my daughter did, sitting under the sun – or more accurately, the son.



There's a verse in Ephesians 5 where it says: '*Everything exposed to the light, itself becomes light*".

You might call this prayer, or contemplation, or 'quiet time'. But whatever name you want to give it – the more time we spend with God – not reeling off our prayer shopping lists, but intentionally sitting and abiding in God's presence, the more we will be absorbing the divine gaze directed at us, and become its reflection.

So, in all you see and experience this week – I hope you will find time to spend in the 'son'light. Take time to encounter more of God, and get some of God's muchneeded light in your life.

I'll leave you with some words from Ephesians 1: '*I pray that your hearts will be* **flooded with light** so that you will know the confident hope he has given to those he called... **Christ fills all things everywhere with himself**.


