Words for Passiontide



We often take words for granted. They are spoken or written and are part of life every day. Some words, however, are special and perhaps only used on specific occasions and words associated with this season of the Christian year are examples of this.

- Passiontide This is the period of time for the last two weeks of Lent. It begins this Sunday and takes us to Easter Day. During these last two weeks of the life of Jesus he experienced ridicule, trial and condemnation to death. He also knew higher moments when God's presence and power were very real.
- Hosanna A word associated with Palm Sunday but having its origins years before. Roger Jones' Musical 'Pharaoh to Freedom' tells of the cry of the Hebrew slaves in Egypt. Their call of 'Hosanna' was a petition to God "Save us we beseech you". The Book of Exodus tells of their release from Egypt by God under his servant Moses. When used on Palm Sunday it can be seen as a cry for Salvation and that Jesus is able to save.
- <u>Remembrance</u> This word was used by Jesus as he shared in the Passover meal with his disciples. He took bread and wine and invited them to share this "In remembrance of me." We continue to follow that invitation today.
- <u>Denial and Betrayal</u> two disciples who 'got it wrong'. Peter denied being a
 Jesus Follower and Judas betrayed Jesus to the Authorities so that he could
 be arrested. Dark words for this Season and a reminder of the sinfulness of
 the human heart.
- Mocking and Suffering Words that sum up the events of Good Friday. The
 life of Jesus led up to the crucifixion, a mystery that Christians have always
 grappled with. Yet in the events of that day, those who have faith, believe
 that God's love was at its greatest and through Jesus' giving of himself we can
 be forgiven and know a new life in him.
- <u>Resurrection</u> The culmination of these two weeks is Easter Sunday, the Day of Resurrection when there are cries of Hallelujah. To fully appreciate what that means, we must travel through the weeks of the Passion.

This is summed up in the following Meditation:

What do we mean by Passion?

It can be overwhelming feelings towards others, perhaps those who feel passionate about the same things as ourselves; perhaps it's the passion of relationship.

But God, in the time of your Passion we think of something which goes almost beyond our understanding. You, the Great King of Heaven, sharing life on earth through the person of Jesus the Son.

His passion embraced compassion – empathy with and for those he met. But more than that, His was a love that was all giving and that love could not be overcome by the taunts and actions of cruel men.

Condemned to death without a true trial; put to suffering because of being a God who differed from what was expected; hung on a cross to die by those who thought to see you defeated for ever.

This was the passion of self-sacrifice and love held out to all who would recognise that here is The Saviour of the World. You Lord continue to offer that love today, inviting us to accept your challenge to follow you and travel beyond death to the new life of Easter.

May we respond and as we take your giving into ourselves, may we be filled with passion for your way and your work, so that we are compelled to share with others the news of a Passionate God.



Redevelopment Coordinator – Role Spec

Job Title: Redevelopment Coordinator

Responsible to: Pioneer Minister, Church Council.

Timeline: 6 - 12 months

About the Project: In 2019 the Bridge youth centre was sold due to repair and maintenance costs. This came with the proviso that the money from this sale would be used for a like-for-like replacement within church premises. This has led to designs being drawn up and plans made for the redevelopment of the Sandgate room into a café/co-working space. This would provide a functional space for youth work, a space suitable for the recent influx of remote workers and generally improve the room for conferencing. We're looking for someone who would be willing to turn these plans into a reality, working with the existing steering group and liaising with contractors to see the practical work done. The plans are there, and church council has approved it, we just need someone to work out what can be done by contractors and what can be done by volunteers.

Responsibilities:

- Work with members of the existing project steering group to familiarise yourself with the project vision.
- Liaise with PMC Property team and keep updated on plans
- Obtain quotes from contractors, building a picture of costs and a timeline for completion.
- Liaise with the operations manager, giving them a good idea of when work will be taking place and how this will impact bookings.
- Work with Pioneer Minister to gather a volunteer team who will help complete appropriate tasks.
- Provide quarterly written reports to church council, keeping them updated of progress.


