The Unexpected Hero

I'm not sure if you've ever met your hero. They say you never should.

Well, I met mine once when I was about seven. I got the opportunity to meet Barry Chuckle of the Chuckle Brothers through a family friend who worked at a theatre they were performing at. So, we turned up before the show



and met him out a back entrance where he was having a cigarette and was understandably quite tired. Whilst this didn't completely ruin my perception of the Chuckle Brothers, the innocent seven-year-old me was quite taken aback to see one of my childhood heroes smoking- something I'd been taught was very bad for you.

There's a reason they say you should never meet your heroes. It's because often, they're not as you expect them to be. Not always in a bad way, just an unexpected way. Jesus was that unexpected hero to many. Whilst his existence was foretold, most people would have expected a military leader to ride into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. One dressed in white flowing robes atop a large stallion and with an impressive entourage in tow. Instead, they saw a man that looked like them. He had dirty, travel weary feet. He wore plain clothes atop an unimpressive donkey. And he was followed by a rag-tag group of working-class people.

Jesus wasn't the hero people expected. But he was the one who showed them what God's love looks like. He was the one who showed them who the power really lay with. He was the one who showed them a different kind of world is possible.

So, when we look for the Christ in this world, I would suggest looking to the rich, attractive, and powerful might not be the best place to start. Instead, I would look to the homeless person curled up in a doorway, the refugee desperate to build a new life, or the addict stuck in their endless cycle. Christ is revealed to us

in unexpected ways and through unexpected people as the person of Jesus demonstrated. Let's not shut ourselves off to those whom we might deem 'less holy' than ourselves. But be open to encountering God at the margins of society this Palm Sunday and beyond.

Job Title: Redevelopment Coordinator

Responsible to: Pioneer Minister, Church Council.


Timeline: 6 - 12 months

About the Project: In 2019 the Bridge youth centre was sold due to repair and maintenance costs. This came with the proviso that the money from this sale would be used for a like-for-like replacement within church premises. This has led to designs being drawn up and plans made for the redevelopment of the Sandgate room into a café/co-working space. This would provide a functional space for youth work, a space suitable for the recent influx of remote workers and generally improve the room for conferencing. We're looking for someone who would be willing to turn these plans into a reality, working with the existing steering group and liaising with contractors to see the practical work done. The plans are there, and church council has approved it, we just need someone to work out what can be done by contractors and what can be done by volunteers.

Responsibilities:

- Work with members of the existing project steering group to familiarise yourself with the project vision.
- Liaise with PMC Property team and keep updated on plans
- Obtain quotes from contractors, building a picture of costs and a timeline for completion.
- Liaise with the operations manager, giving them a good idea of when work will be taking place and how this will impact bookings.
- Work with Pioneer Minister to gather a volunteer team who will help complete appropriate tasks.
- Provide quarterly written reports to church council, keeping them updated of progress.


<u>JPIT Internships</u>
