Choose Life



"Today I have given you the choice between life and death, between blessings and curses... Oh, that you would choose life, so that you and your descendants might live!"

Deuteronomy 30:19 (NLT)

I'm writing this as we go into Holy week. Depending on when you read it, it could be anytime between Maundy Thursday and Easter – or later!

So, what to reflect on? The awful events of Good Friday and Jesus' crucifixion? The waiting of the Saturday when all was numb, and dead? Or the joy of Easter Sunday, and the celebration of new life in the risen Jesus!

I believe Jesus gave his life so that we might know life. He went to the cross to show there is nothing we can do, no amount of evil we can do to each other, that will be able to stop God loving us; nothing we can do to separate us from God. In fact, Jesus proves his love to us by taking us at our very lowest and worst point and saying "Yes, you do this to me, but as the forgiving victim, I'm showing you a new way to live – a new way to inhabit love".

Easter Sunday was the victory of God's love! The proof that love wins!

So, here's the point. Our world seems in a crazy place right now. Financial markets are tumbling. Putin, Trump, Netanyahu, and all are on some power fuelled drive to build their empires – all at the cost of the neediest. Thousands are dying in wars. Humanitarian aid to the least and the poorest is reducing, while money spent on arms is increasing. And we are slowly destroying our planet through our destruction of creation.

Life seems more like Good Friday than Easter Sunday.

And yet – there is a choice we can make. It's the same choice Moses gives the people of Israel in the verse above. It's the choice Jesus died to make possible.

But it's up to us to choose it.

The theologian Matthew Fox says this: "To know Resurrection I need to be Resurrection myself. That means I cannot dwell in despair and death and anger and oppression and submission and resentment and pain forever. I need to wake up, get up, rise up, put on life even when days are dark and my soul is down and shadows surround me everywhere.... I have to listen to the voice that says: "Be Resurrection. Be born again, and again, and again. Rise up and be counted. Rise up and inhabit the good news deeply—that death does not conquer, that life, not death, has the last word...."

To live the life that Jesus died and rose again to bring us, means intentionally choosing to speak hope into hopelessness and to bring love where there is hate. To be fully alive means knowing that God is alive, and is with us, and for us – and for the whole world – and wants to bring redemption, and freedom, and new life.

We are Resurrection people! We can bring aliveness and rebirth and hope into the world, however distressing the news becomes. That is what it means to believe in Easter Sunday and the Resurrection.

This is what it means to choose life!


As always, you are most welcome to our "All Together Fellowship "
