"I'll show you my faith by my work." (James 2.18)

As Christians, disciples of Jesus, when is the right time to roll our sleeves up and take action in building God's Kingdom? And, when is the right time to stop, and to be still in his presence, listening for the whisper of his voice, sitting quietly at his feet? What is the right balance between action and stillness?

What's going on in this painting, I wonder. The trouble is no one is quite certain. Is that a painting on the wall in the top right corner? Or is it a serving hatch or a mirror, through which we see into the next room?

For what it's worth, here's my best guess... The serving girl is working away hard on the left to make an aioli from the crushed garlic. She looks a bit grumpy, though, doesn't she, as if she isn't best pleased to be here. The older woman behind her points to the picture on the wall, as if to say, "Think about the story of Mary and Martha. You're just like Martha, complaining all the time about all the work that you've been left to do, without any help. Stop grumbling and get

on with it!" I guess, then, the poor girl's reaction might well be to reply, "It would be great if I could leave all this, go and sit down, and listen to the stories of Jesus. But that won't get this aioli made."

In Luke's gospel, the story of Mary and Martha is immediately after the parable of the Good Samaritan. I wonder why he chose to put the two stories in juxtaposition like that. Mary has "chosen what is better" by leaving the chores of the kitchen behind in order to get closer to Jesus and sit at his feet. But the Good Samaritan does NOT say, "Well, it's time that I listened to some of Jesus' teaching. Pouring oil and wine onto wounds can wait until later." No, instead of hurrying off down the road like the others, so that he can get to the temple to worship and read the Scriptures, he's going to show his faith through his actions.

There is always work to be done and jobs to attend to. Perhaps the older woman is simply saying, "Stop moaning. Stop grumbling and grousing. Get on with the task set before you..." Do we work grudgingly or happily? Do we get the right balance between action and contemplation? Moreover, do we work only for reward and recognition, expecting some sort of payment at the end, even if it is just an acknowledgement, a bunch of flowers or a Thank You? Is this Martha's mistake in being so grumpy and grumbling? Was she doing the work expecting praise?

Ever felt under-appreciated?

Why did the Good Samaritan do what he did? What was his motive... if any? Did he do it for reward or acknowledgement? And, in the end, is that why this girl is so grumpy? "No one appreciates all this hard work I'm doing..."

This Sunday marks the start of Christian Aid week. Perhaps now might be the right time to roll our sleeves up (like the servant girl in the painting) and put faith into action.
