Fairy Tales



We are in the Season between Easter and Pentecost when we traditionally remember the Appearances of the Risen Lord Jesus. Have you tried to imagine the feelings of those who lived through this period? They began with the desolation of Good Friday, continued with the uncertainty of Holy Saturday and hardly dare

believe the events of Easter Day. Then they met the Risen Christ in different locations and circumstances and had to try to understand what it all meant for them. This was not made easy by the words of Jesus when he told them to wait for a gift (The Holy Spirit) and they would then have more work to do.

You could not make this story up and yet if it was heard by someone with no knowledge of the Christian faith it would read somewhat like a Fairy Tale. Is this just a work of fiction, telling a story which might have a moral to it?

What are Fairy Tales? They are the work of writers who told a story which is often far fetched, set often in a bygone time, which may give pleasure and interest or be scary to young children. I read a story of a young child who had been learning about moral values – right and wrong – kindness to overcome injustice etc. When Fairy Stories were read to her she objected. The characters showed meanness not kindness. Bad things happened which could have played out so differently. Why were they told like this? The Mother used her imagination and turned the stories around to find the good in the accounts and the child went to sleep far more happily.

We read in <u>2 Peter 1:16</u> from the Living Bible:

'For we have not been telling you fairy tales when we explained to you the power of our Lord Jesus Christ and his coming again. My own eyes have seen his splendour and his glory.'



Peter, along with the other early followers of Jesus, came to see that the words and actions of the Risen One were far from Fairy Tales. Rather these would become their whole experience and by following his command they would begin to change the world.

We have a Living Gospel to lead us to a Living Faith. No Fairy Tales here but a promise of a God who is alive.

- Methodist Women in Cumbria in Zoom link up with Methodist Women in Argentina!

Good Friday 2025 included a 'first' for the Cumbria – Argentina partnership when 4 Cumbrian women shared in a Good Friday time of reflection with women from across Argentina through a Zoom link. It had been an enthusiastic and spontaneous invitation from Ana Bustos, co-ordinator of 'FeMMA' (the Argentine equivalent of MWiB), with little opportunity to prepare! However, what couldn't be understood in all the talking in Spanish was conveyed through the warmth of participants in Argentina to each other and to 'Cumbria'! Occasionally someone expressed something in English and Cumbria were able to give a greeting (in Spanish!) and share a Taize song which was much appreciated. There was a strong sense of us being held together through the Holy Spirit during readings, prayer and individual 'testimony' on the theme 'Jesus- remember me'.

The atmosphere was one of joy and warm hospitality, along with listening to people's stories – with sensitive support and care being conveyed on 'chat'. For the Cumbrian four it was a very special experience to mark Good Friday. We could have chosen to opt for a future occasion so we could be better prepared – but it seemed right to 'just do it' and rely on God to enable the special closeness which emerged.
