

Weekly Bulletin Sunday 1st June

For the first time in four years of writing these reflections, I turned to the lectionary to see what this week's reading offers. The reading is taken from Acts 16 and recounts the events of Paul getting so frustrated with an enslaved fortune teller who kept shouting the praises of God, that he cast the spirit out of her. Meaning, her owners could no longer make money from her and had Paul and Silas beaten and thrown in jail for upsetting the peace.

However, their chains don't stop them from worshipping God – praying and singing. In doing so the Spirit comes with such a force it breaks the chains, shakes the prison and opens the doors.

I wonder if you've ever experienced the spirit entering a place in such power before. Maybe you don't even believe it's possible. When the charismatic revival was taking place in the late 80's/early 90's, I'm told there was no script and no timings, just an anticipation to see the spirit move in incredible ways. Now, even the most Pentecostal churches have timings on their order of service and make sure everything is kept to time.

We see this in our own worship, everything timed and controlled. But what would it look like to let go of the elements we 'have to include' and just let the spirit guide us? What would it look like if we worshipped with a true anticipation of seeing the spirit move in our lives and the life of the church. This doesn't necessarily have to look like people being healed, demons being cast out, or buildings being shaken. It could just be a profound sense of peace, clarity, or love.

This is where we see lots of new forms of church that are just starting out, ditching the order of service and approaching worship in a different way, a way that seeks to be attentive to how the spirit is moving. Now, I could be wrong here, and you may think I'm being too critical. I simply want us to pause and reflect on whether the way we've always done things is the way that is most fulfilling. If you come to the conclusion that it is, carry on! I just hope we are never afraid to review things and change if we feel God is calling us to do so.
