

Weekly Bulletin Sunday 13th July Lead me to the Rock

Many of David's psalms (of which there are seventy-five) are full of praise and rejoicing but others contain darker themes as a result of his complicated life from an overlooked boy to an anointed warrior king with more than his fair share of character flaws.

As a poet and musician he was not shy in airing his fears, desperations, confusion, anger... to name but a few.



But his willingness to wear his heart on his sleeve: his tears, his confessions, his pleas have been a source of much comfort to so many across the ages, a rich well of words and prayers from which to draw when facing our own trying circumstances.



Probably being pursued, in Psalm 61 David voices his need for cover and safety, possibly in a place he was unfamiliar with: 'From the ends of the earth I call to you, I call as my heart grows faint'. Then a profound request: 'Lead me to the rock which is higher than I'. Although he has a need to physically hide, he also wants to, once again, know God as a personal protector because he goes on to recall God's goodness in the past, 'For you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the foe'. This is mirrored elsewhere in his psalms, E.g. 'my rock, in whom I take refuge' (Ps 18:2).

The Apostle Paul in recalling Israel's history says this: 'For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.' (1 Cor 10:1-3)

Are you discouraged or overwhelmed? Are you in need of spiritual refuge? Remember God's goodness to you in the past and be led to your rock, Jesus, who is higher than all, who was anointed to bring good news to the poor and comfort to the broken-hearted. He alone is our rock and salvation. (Ps 62:2)

If you prefer not to walk, you are very welcome to come to our house any time from about 2 15pm and enjoy a social get-together with refreshments mid-afternoon.


