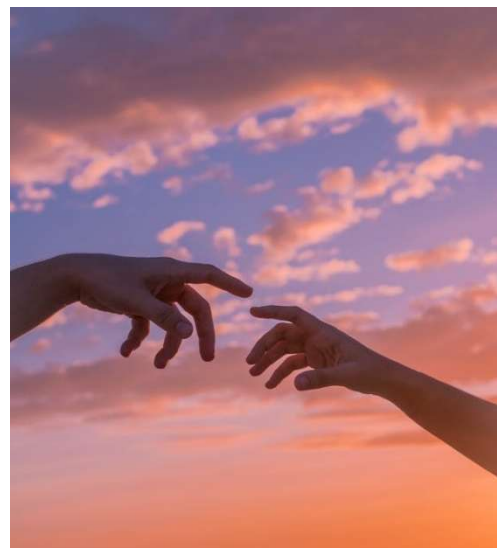
1 Corinthians 1:10

I haven't checked but I think most of Paul's letters make some reference to the importance of Christian unity, with of course the imagery of the church being a body, different parts but all working together as a whole. And we are so connected, Paul says later in 1 Corinthians, that when one part suffers, all the other parts suffer as well (12:26).

It's clear from Paul's concerns that divisiveness fuelled by selfishness was as much of an issue in the early church as it sadly is today. Paul himself knew suffering at the hands of the Corinthian church which he later describes as a 'painful visit' having had his teaching rejected and his apostleship ridiculed. Some of you might remember the devotion I did a while back about the Lord's prayer with its emphasis on the plural: our Father, give us our daily bread, forgive us, lead us and deliver us.

Of course, Jesus himself prayed in earnest for us in John 17:22 *'that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one'*.

So the phrase 'we are in this together' is an entirely appropriate way of thinking about church.



Here's a lovely quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer: 'It is the voice of the Church that is heard in singing together. It is not you that sings, it is the Church that is singing, and you, as a member of the Church, may share in its song.'

What a privilege it is to be able to share in the 'song' of the church, being united together for the purpose which Jesus prayed for us, which Jesus says is this: '*so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me.*'

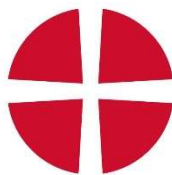

Isabella Sharrock, daughter of Kerrie and David, is once again doing the Great North Run. This time for Shelter, she says:

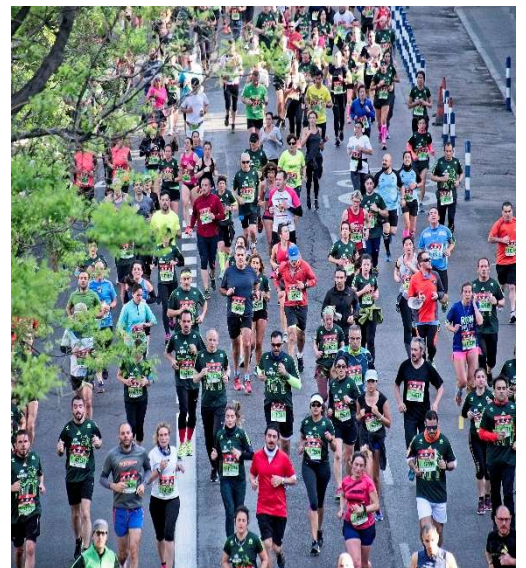

## 4F

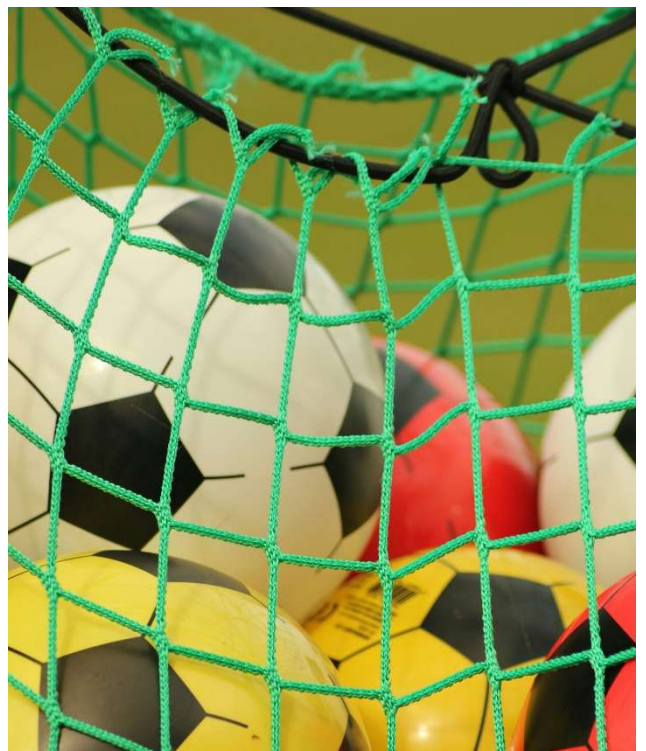
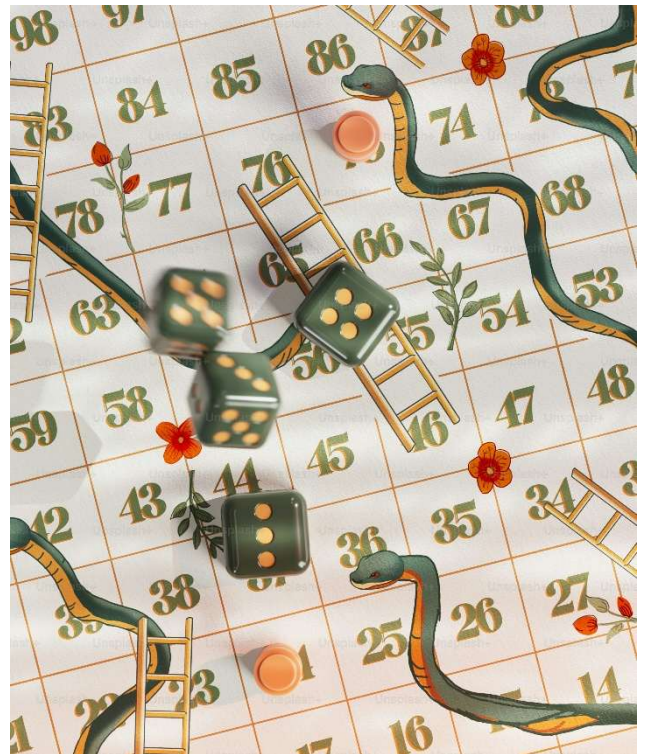

In spite of hopes and promises, Ukraine still desperately needs our help. Some of the urgent and ongoing needs are:

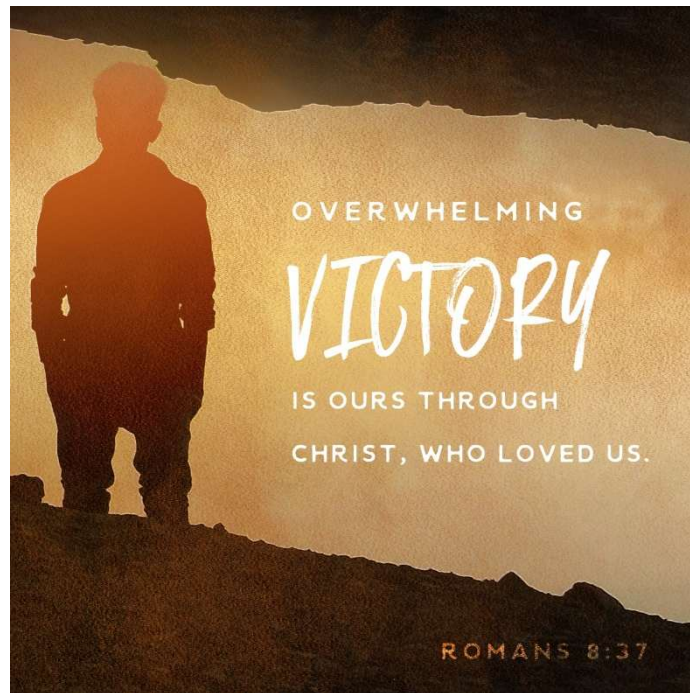
- Soap
