


Weekly Bulletin Sunday 26th October

Numbers

We came to Cumbria 30 years ago and joined what was then the Penrith Circuit. I had only been here a few short weeks when I was asked if I could sort out the financial details for a church, now long closed. The details given to the Minister did not make much sense and I had to ask questions and try to get 'the picture' so that I could draw up a balance sheet for the year. Such tasks have come my way on many occasions, right up to the present time, as I have tried to sort out the finances for chapels and other charitable organisations. I never trained as an



accountant but having to deal with figures for my work was a great help.

Numbers play a significant part in all aspects of life. We need to know what numbers mean for church finances, our own home and personal monies, for the distances to and from places, and generally how to add, subtract, multiply and divide. Do we always get the right answers?

We watch the TV programme 'Countdown' and numbers play a significant part in the final scores. Six numbers have to be used, in any combination to make a random total and anyone who struggles with this is unlikely to win.

The Bible contains the Book of Numbers in the Old Testament. It is perhaps read rarely as we are unwilling to wade through all the statistics given there.



The Introduction to the book in the Good News Bible tells us: 'Numbers is an account of people who were often discouraged and afraid of hardship and who rebelled against God and Moses. It is a story of God's faithful consistent care for his people in spite of their weaknesses and disobedience.' To God each one still mattered, they were not 'just a number'.

Jesus told us in both the Gospels of Matthew and Luke that we should not be afraid for God knows each one individually and even the hairs on our heads are all numbered. If he is aware of each member of his creation like this and cares what happens to us all, then we are the 'number' that matters. We thank God for his Greatness shown to everyone in tender loving care.




### **Averil Cozens**
